CRP ORDER OF SELECTION

- 1) A CRP identifies a need and negotiates satisfactorily with a government customer to fulfill that need, or a government customer identifies an unfulfilled need and negotiates with a CRP to meet that need. The CRP identifying an opportunity may ask for and be granted time to perform due diligence to fulfill the needs of the government customer(s).
- 2) A government buyer identifies an unfulfilled need and asks two or more CRPs for a proposal. A government buyer can state a preference for the selection of a particular CRP.
- 3) OPCRP suggests/presents an opportunity to all, or a group of, CRPs. Selection will be based upon:
 - a) CRP's compliance with the legislation, administrative rules and DAS/OPCRP policies and procedures.
 - b) A CRP's proximity to the specified work site for a requested service.
 - c) The dollar value of any other contracts held by interested CRPs immediately prior to the selection of a CRP to provide the product or service.
 - d) CRP that can provide the service or product at the best price.
 - e) CRP's past performance on any other contract(s) to provide products and services to government entities. A CRP known for quality and/or with the fewest quality complaints will have an edge.
 - f) CRP that has a large unemployed population of persons with disabilities, does not currently have an OPCRP contract, has not ever been awarded an OPCRP contract or has not had an OPCRP contract for some time.
 - g) CRP that can demonstrate fiscal, technological, managerial and human capital capability.
- 4) The selection decision of the manager of OPCRP is final.

Note: A CRP may choose to use the services of an agent certified by OPCRP. An agent is permitted to charge for its services. Those charges must be part of the CRPs final price proposal and will be compared to the final price proposals of other interested CRPs.
