JOB DUTIES IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE: (These duties are illustrative only. Incumbents may perform some or all of these duties or other job-related duties as assigned.)

Receives extensive training in watercraft laws & regulations (e.g., criminal laws; civil laws, laws of evidence; methods of arrest; search & seizure; investigative skills; handling of prisoners; court conduct; patrolling & enforcement techniques; use of firearms; self defense; first aid & emergency care).

Receives extensive training in watercraft law enforcement, accident investigation, search & rescue procedures, boat & pursuit operation; learns enforcement of 'operating under the influence' & 'drug laws' on water; learns public speaking & teaching skill development; learns to develop lesson plans & student performance objectives; learns rescue techniques on flat & moving water, floods & ice.

Reviews & drafts reports for division capital improvements & reviews status of existing boat facilities; prepares reports regarding effects of existing watercraft laws & regulations, acts as on-scene supervisor of critical incidents (e.g., chemical spill exposure).

Knowledge of watercraft safety practices; supervisory principles & methods; laws & department rules & regulations governing watercraft operations (i.e., Ohio Revised Code Chapters 1547 & 1548); public relations; employee training & development. Ability to interpret variety of instructions in written, oral, picture or schedule form; prepare & deliver lectures before general & technical audiences; gather, collate & classify information about data, people or things; handle sensitive inquiries from & contacts with officials & general public; add, subtract, multiply & divide whole numbers; write &/or edit articles for publication; demonstrate physical fitness.

Successful completion of Ohio Basic Peace Officer Training; commissioned as watercraft officer by Ohio Department Of Natural Resources, Division Of Watercraft; completion of associate core program in natural resource area (e.g., parks & recreation; forestry; fisheries; wildlife; resource development; environmental education); 5 yrs. trg. or 5 yrs. exp. in law enforcement; 5 yrs. trg. or 5 yrs. exp. in operation, maintenance & safety practices associated with watercraft & in water rescue techniques or in teaching boating safety & presenting safe boating lectures to include operation of audio/visual equipment; 12 mos. trg. or 12 mos. exp. in budgeting; 2 yrs. trg. or 2 yrs. exp. in supervisory principles & techniques; must be able to swim 300 yds. in 8 minutes or less; must be able to tread water for minimum of 5 minutes; must be able to perform surface dive.
